

AUGUST 12, 2019 MONTHLY MEETING

TOWN OF HARRISON

The regular monthly meeting for the Town of Harrison was held on Monday, August 12, 2019 at Northland Church. Notice of the meeting was posted as required by law. Present at the meeting were John Phillips, Diane Troast, Patricia Johnson, Bob Kasson, Bob Opperman, Rodney Gill, Kyle Fisher, Mike Schultz, Ann Cassamassa, Jon Ann Kasson, and Fran Moen. Chairman Dean Lashua called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M.

The Clerk's minutes from the previous meeting were read. A motion was made by Mike Schultz and second by Ann Cassamassa to accept the minutes as read. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was presented to the Board. The beginning balance on July 1, 2019 was \$72,137.18. Deposits for the month totaled \$36,274.35. The total of checks and withdrawals for the month was \$80,813.03. The ending balance in the checkbook on July 31, 2019 was \$27,598.50, the beginning balance in the Money Market account was \$21,804.24. Interest collected for the month was \$7.89 leaving a balance in the account of \$21,812.13.

OLD BUSINESS: NONE

NEW BUSINESS: Kyle Fisher presented 2 survey maps to the board for approval of zoning changes. Gordan Barth has a 5 acre parcel and Ryan Everson has a 9 acre parcel. These changes meet the requirements of the zoning laws in the Town of Harrison. A motion was made by Ann Cassamassa and second by Mike Schultz to accept the survey maps as presented. Motion carried. Gene Goody was contacted to see if the Township could get any funds that may be available to help

offset the cost of the ATV/UTV signs placed in the Town. The Board was told that none are available. We have applied to Emergency Management of Waupaca County for funds to help in the cleanup of the storm that went through our Township. This will be turned over to FEMA and they will determine if we are available for any reimbursement. A motion was made by Ann Cassamassa and second by Mike Schultz pass a Disaster Declaration that will be needed if we are eligible for any assistance. Motion carried. The trees and debris left by the recent storm along our town roads will be cleaned up by John Orvedahl in the coming weeks. A complaint was received by the Board in regard to animals getting out through a fence shared by John Grover and Mark Kraklow. A letter will be sent to both parties informing them of the responsibilities they have in construction and maintenance of a fence shared by both parties. The Wisconsin State Statues regarding a shared fence line will be enclosed to help them get this matter resolved. Calls and concerns received by the Board during the month were discussed by the Board. A motion was made by Mike Schultz and second by Ann Cassamassa to adjourn the meeting at 7:30 P.M. Motion carried.
