

MAY 14, 2018 MONTHLY MEETING

TOWN OF HARRISON

The regular monthly meeting for the Town of Harrison was held on Monday, May 14, 2018 at Northland Church. Notice of the meeting was posted as required by law. Chairman Lee Halverson called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M. Present at the meeting were Bob Opperman, Bob Kasson, Jon Ann Kasson, Fran Moen, Mike Schultz, Dan Powell, Leticia Baudhuin, Diane Trost, John Phillips, Nathan Holder, Lee Lehrer, Joe McClone, Jan Lehrer, Leanne Domask, Amber Birling, Carrie Powell, Lee Birling, Verlyn Hanson, and Shirley Hanson.

The Clerk's minutes from the previous meeting were read. A motion was made by Bob Opperman and second by Bob Kasson to accept the minutes as read. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was given. The beginning balance on April 1, 2018 was \$119,551.58. Deposits for the month were \$28,438.92. The total checks written and withdrawals for the month was \$13,974.64. The ending balance on April 30, 2018 was \$134,015.86. The Money Market Account had a beginning balance of \$71,599.87. The interest collected for the month was \$30.41 leaving an ending balance of \$71,630.28.

OLD BUSINESS: NONE

NEW BUSINESS: A motion was made by Bob Opperman and second by Bob Kasson to grant tavern license to Schmidt's Corners LLC and Northland Sport's Bar and Grill LLC. Motion carried. A motion was made by Bob Opperman and second by Bob Kasson to grant bartender license to Stephanie Hackbarth, Adam Garvey, Brittany Wandel, and Cynthia Berry. Motion carried.

Public comments on road conditions in the winter within the Town were taken from a group of concerned citizens led by Nathan Holder. Some of the issues brought before the board were snow left at intersections, lack of sand on the roads, lowering the plow blade plowing the roads more often, getting the plow out earlier and plowing the dead-end roads sooner. The Board will look into these matters in the coming months and seek options they can pursue to correct this situation.

Waupaca County gathered cost estimates from the Townships to see if we qualified for emergency relief from the Federal government for Storm Evelyn. Enough was not spent to qualify.

Calls received during the month were discussed by the Board. A motion was made by Bob Kasson and second by Lee Halverson to adjourn the meeting at 7:45 P.M. Motion carried.
