

SEPTEMBER 12, 2016 MONTHLY MEETING
TOWNSHIP OF HARRISON

The regular monthly meeting for the Township of Harrison was held on Monday, September 12, 2016 at Northland Church. Notice of the meeting was published in the Waupaca County Post. Chairman Lee Halverson called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M. Present at the meeting were Bob Kasson, Jon Ann Kasson, Bob Opperman, Fran Moen, Dan Dowell, Mike and Becky Schultz, Jack Bazile, John Orverdahl and Mark Kraklow.

The Clerk's minutes from the previous meeting were read. A motion was made by Bob Opperman and second by Bob Kasson to accept the minutes as read. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was given. The beginning balance on August, 2016 was \$54699.48. Deposits for the month of August totaled \$31136.05. The total amount of the checks written were \$8480.56. The ending balance on August 31, 2016 was \$76681.97. The beginning balance in the Money Market account was \$59689.05. Interest collected for the month was \$22.90 leaving a balance of \$59711.95 in the account.

OLD BUSINESS: The fund raiser for the Northwest First Responders that was held on Labor Day weekend in the Township took in \$6500.00.

NEW BUSINESS: Jon Ann Kasson informed the board that the computer programming used by Waupaca County for the collection of taxes has been sold to another company called Transcendent Technology. There has been a price increase and after this year there will be an additional charge for handling the collection of dog license. A motion was made by Bob Kasson and second by Bob Opperman to contract this firm for the 2017 tax collections. Motion carried. The Board will collect information in the coming year to determine how tax collections will be handled in the future.

A motion was made by Lee Halverson and second by Bob Opperman to postpone the monthly meeting at 7:00 P.M. to hold a Public Hearing. Motion carried.

The regular monthly meeting was called back to order at 7:30 P.M by Chairman Lee Halverson.

The annual bridge inspections have been completed in the Township. Bob Opperman has put up new signs as required. The remaining maintenance on the bridges will need to be contracted out. There are no safety issues involved with the remaining work to be done. A motion was made by Bob Opperman and second by Lee Halverson to address the remaining issues next year. Motion carried.

American Asphalt is working with Mark Moen to correct the problems with his property and Wolf River Road. The Town will raise the road by his property and install a culvert to help with the drainage problem. The Board has signed a road agreement with the Town of Germania and are waiting to get the paper work back from them. The Paser report has been filled out and will be returned to the state.

A motion was made by Bob Kasson and second by Lee Halverson to adjourn the meeting at 8:10 P.M. Motion carried.
